Drug and Alcohol Abuse Prevention

Drug Violations and Consequences

Annenberg School of Nursing has a zero tolerance policy for illegal drug abuse and alcohol use on campus and for students attending class or clinical sites while intoxicated. Convictions for drug violations while receiving Federal Student Aid can impact eligibility for receiving aid.
