

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

The Annenberg School of Nursing (ASN) a program of the Los Angeles Jewish Home, is one of the nation's leading nursing schools. Located on the Home's Hirsch Family Campus in the San Fernando Valley, ASN offers comprehensive Vocational Nurse (VN), Nurse Assistant (NA), and Home Health Aide (HHA) programs. Our programs provide students the opportunity to work with a variety of patients, residents, and other healthcare professionals.

At ASN, classes are taught in an interactive format combining classroom instruction with hands-on practice. Our small class sizes provide personalized instruction. Individual and group assistance is available. Our pass rates are consistently above state averages. Tuition for ASN programs are all-inclusive. Various payment options are available. Federal Financial Aid is available for qualifying VN students.

The skills you learn at ASN positively impact your life: leadership, teamwork, problem solving, communication and teaching skills. We are dedicated to helping you succeed.

Vocational Nursing Program

The comprehensive vocational nurse program at The Annenberg School of Nursing prepares you to take the NCLEX-PN® California state licensing exam. The 13-month, full-time class meets daily Monday through Friday. Curriculum content includes, anatomy and physiology, pharmacology, fundamentals of nursing, medical surgical nursing and obstetric and maternal child nursing. Clinical hours are performed at a variety of local hospitals, clinics and skilled nursing and rehabilitation facilities. Obstetric and maternal child nursing is taught in part with the assistance of a birthing manikin.

The vocational nurse program is designed to provide students with the knowledge and skills necessary for an entry-level position as a vocational nurse in a medical office, clinic, HMO, acute-care hospital, long-term care facility or other healthcare setting in which vocational nurses are employed. Nursing Assistant

The nursing assistant program at ASN is full-time Monday through Friday and prepares students for the state certification examination. The program consists of 60 hours of theory and 116 clinical hours.

The curriculum includes patients' rights, safety procedures, the aging process, personal care, vital signs, admissions, transfer and discharges, death and dying, time management, and specific state requirements for certified nursing assistants.

Home Health Aide

ASN's Home Health Aide program trains students to help people who are elderly, disabled, chronically ill, or cognitively impaired. Home health aides assist with activities such as bathing and dressing, as well as provide other services, such as light housekeeping, meal preparation, medication assistance and transportation assistance. Home health aides work mainly in private homes. The five day (40 hour) program meets daily Monday through Friday.
